We have seen a huge shift over the past few years in students being so open to talk about the need for friendship, community and faith.

There was a recent survey done on university campuses across the UK that showed that 76% of students who aren't Christians say that they would go to church if a friend invited them! 45% of non-Christians would like to hear the story of Jesus! This is a massive opportunity that we don't want to miss!

This is not just something that we are seeing in the UK. Just this week I have been hearing more and more stories about the response some of our campus ministries across Europe are having as a result of engaging students this year.
